Sub: Campus re-opening in offline mode for First Year and Higher Semester Students

Dear All,

We are currently battling, perhaps, the biggest global challenge that we have seen in our lifetime yet. 2020 and 2021 will be remembered as years with more challenges than opportunities..!! COVID-19 forced a new 'normal' upon people, industries and sectors, most notably the education sector.

Universities and other educational institutions across the country had to be closed in March 2020 because of the COVID-19 outbreak and went online so as to ensure continuity in teaching-learning process by making the best use of e-resources enabling the student community to stay connected with their education. Though online education helped to fill up the gap, yet the students belonging to professional, and all other courses were missing the efficacy of offline classroom lectures, experiential learning, practical components, face to face interaction with faculties and their peers, etc.


In the present scenario, as the Covid-19 pandemic has drastically come down with effective vaccination drive and as per the Government guidelines, all the educational institutions including schools are open for the normal academic activity. It's the time to move ahead with an optimistic mind to offline campus learning, which plays an important role in the academic career of students.

Based on the directives proposed by the Covid-19 Cell at MUJ, the following decisions have been made.

For First Year Students

- 1. The classes for First Year students (Semester II) will be in Offline (face to face) mode with effect from 21st March 2022.
- 2. As per University norms, 75% of physical attendance is mandatory for all students.
- 3. All the evaluations, namely, MTE I, MTE II, Practical and ETE will be conducted in Offline mode as per the academic calendar.





4. Those students who may not be able to attend offline classes may write to the Director-Academics with their parent's consent for which the decision will be taken later on. Such students will be intimated of the mode of conduction of classes separately.

For Higher Semester Students

- The classes for Higher Semester students will be strictly in Offline (face to face) mode with effect from 5th April 2022.
- 2. As per University norms, **75% of physical attendance is mandatory** for all students for the rest of the sessions.
- 3. All the evaluations, namely MTE II, Practical and ETE will be conducted in Offline mode.
- 4. Those students who may not be able to attend offline classes may write to their Head of the Department (HOD) with their parent's consent for which the decision will be taken later on. Such students will be intimated of the mode of conduction of classes separately.
