

ALUMNI TALK - How do we re-imagine a living city?

Session by Ar. Parul Sharma – An Alumni of School of Architecture and Design,
03rd Oct. 2020

School of Architecture & Design, Manipal University Jaipur, organized a knowledge sharing talk by Ar. Parul Sharma titled 'How do we re-imagine a living City?', on 03rd October 2020. Ar. Parul holds a bachelor's degree in Architecture batch 2012-17 of SA&D Manipal University Jaipur. After which she completed her master's degree in Urban Planning from CEPT University, Ahmedabad in June 2020. Parul interned with Charles Correa Foundation, Panaji, Goa as an architect and with the public sector planning agency, Naya Raipur Development Authority as an urban planner. Currently, she is working as an Associate Consultant at Athena Infonomics which is a data-driven global consultancy. SESSION: Indian Cities are expected to prepare a Development Plan or Master Plan which provides a macro-level framework of land-use zoning, transportation, infrastructure, etc. However, such plans largely remain under implemented or sometimes even unimplemented, due to the lacunas in micro-level planning. Eventually, Cities keep growing rapidly on their fringes, while their existing urban areas remain underutilized and underserved. The development that results on-ground seems generally chaotic, mired by congestion, and lacks connectivity. This is partly because the planning and design process has been carried out as a two-dimensional arithmetic driven process, in most cases devoid of aspects of "liveability", "sustainability", "mobility", "safety", and "character". Ar. Parul will present the preparation of an implementable micro-level plan which goes beyond conventional statutory plans and explores the most appropriate methods available with urban planners to create inclusive, compact and people oriented cities.

The session proved very helpful to the young minds and made them aware of many new aspects related and beyond the Architecture and Design.
